Coming up this Sunday, April 6, 2008 is our Annual Spring Hunter Pace. Once again it starts off from the Mattern Farm at 2710 Station Road in Middletown Maryland, our Station Road fixture, at 10:00 AM. The courses start and finish with a dramatic river crossing made all the more exciting last year as the riders splashed across the finish in frigid temperatures and blustery snow. Our courses are 3 1/2 miles of beautiful mountain vistas. Both the low and high courses have 18 jumps, which at the riders discretion can all be ridden around. Low jumps are up to 2' 6" and high jumps are up to 3'. Thanks to Kerry Mattern and Dicky Gibson, landowners extraordinaire, and a lot of hard working NM-MVH members, we have a nice variety of jumps including coops, rail jumps, bank jumps, stone walls and log jumps and a phenomenal piece of property on which to hold our event that challenges riders with lots of hills and two river crossings. Also known as "pairs" races, a hunter pace is a team of two or more riders following a cross country course of about 3- 4 miles in simulated hunting conditions (no hounds). Required attire consists of protective headgear, tall boots (NO CHAPS!) and formal hunt attire or ratcatcher (show coat or tweed). Junior riders are 18 years of age and under. Get a group together from your barn and enter as a team!

Classes are:

1. Fast Time Over High Fences (3'-3'6")

2. Optimum Time Over Low Fences (up to 2'6")

3. Jr. Optimum Time Over Low Fences

4. Optimum Time Over High Fences

5. Optimum Time Flat

6. Jr. Optimum Time Flat

We have quite a few hounds to campaign this year. First up will be the Maryland Puppy Show on May 4th. For this show we have Kelly and Hercules' pups to show, and a few of them look quite nice and have a good chance. Then we will attend the Carolinas Hound Show on Saturday May 17th, the Virginia Hound Show on Sunday May 25th and the Bryn Mawr Hound Show in Pennsylvania on Saturday May 31st. At these shows we will be showing Hercules in the American Stallion class, Louise in the Crossbred Brood Bitch and Jury in the Listed Penn Marydel- Entered class. Jade, Jury's sister who has done so well for us the past couple of years will not be showing this year as she has had an amorous adventure with a certain De La Brooke hound, Konniver. Jade, we wish you luck!

Logic will try to better his placing in the Crossbred Dog- Entered class with another year of growth under his belt. We may give Liberty a chance in Crossbred Bitch-Entered. Then they will team up for the Couple of Unentered Dogs. We may even try to get together a pack class if we can field five couple that look uniform enough to compete.

The three big shows we go to are all different. The Carolina Hound Show is in Southern Pines, NC, and is a laid back, comfortable show. There is a pre-show barbecue on Friday before the show that is really fun. Saturday we show hounds in the most beautiful rings I have shown in, under a canopy of pines. At this point, it is my favorite show to attend.

The Virginia Hound Show is a more formal affair and is the closest for our members to attend, being held at Morven Park in Leesburg. We normally set up our canopy at the end of the Crossbred ring in the shade and members and friends from other clubs stop by. The Goshen folks set up next to us at the American ring and we banter back and forth all day.

There is an area where vendors set up and food is available aside from our tailgates.

The Bryn Mawr Hound show at the Radnor Hunt Club is the oldest show in the United States. It is the Upperville of the hound show circuit. Beautiful shade trees at a beautiful club house ant grounds. This show is classy and comfortable to attend. It takes about three hours to get there and I think it is worth the drive

These shows take place in May and the first week of June. At the end of the circuit we are tired of the work and traveling, but we are proud of our hounds. We want everyone to see them and we love to compete. When we win it is a great feeling and when we don't we still know we gave our best.

As I say every year, hound shows are great fun. You get to network with other clubs, see old friends and make new ones. Come out to some of the closer ones and see what I mean! 


